In 2022/23 we piloted a great many community projects at the Loreburn Hall. One of these was the Dumfries School of Samba which is something we have received funding to develop over the next year.

We are trying to raise £1800 for the Samba drums. So any donation to this would be appreciated.

This will be a session which runs every Wednesday in Dumfries town centre, complementing our existing Community Choir programme which runs on a Tuesday night.

Samba drumming comes from Brasil and the group ensemble style is very good for persons where English is not their first language. Drumming and rhythm is non-verbal, and Samba is rooted in the Carnival movement.

This will enable a new community music project to be started in Dumfries, which has the capacity to be cross generational and inclusive of multi-culture.

- 30 adults and 6 young people a week will take part in group activities that will help boost their wellbeing (and get them off digital devices).
- Local galas and festivals will benefit from us having a new Community Band marching band which will give energy to more activities.

Good afternoon.

Would your Community Council consider helping us with the cost of what we are doing with school children in schools in Dumfries & Galloway. At present we are teaching Highland bagpipes and Pipe Band drumming to around 170 children in 17 schools in our region, and also online, where we cannot afford to have a tutor in schools at present.

Our aim is to have two, or hopefully three Dumfries & Galloway Schools Pipe Bands able to play for communities in our region, supporting local gala days and events, and attracting visitors. At present we have one Dumfries & Galloway Schools Pipe Band well established and already playing at local events. Our Band competed very successfully at the Scottish National Schools Pipe Band Competition, in March this year, coming second in a class of 11 bands - 6 of which came from private fee paying schools, where piping and drumming tuition is part of the school's curriculum. Our Pipe Band was made up of children from 12 schools from across our region -- from Annan in the East to Newton Stewart in the West, and from Moffat in the North to Kirkcudbright in the South. - and perhaps from your local school(s).

Our aim at present, is to have two Dumfries & Galloway Schools Pipe Bands competing at this National Competition on Sunday 9th March 2025 in Kilmarnock. We have been champions in our class at this competition in 2019, two bands each coming second in their respective classes in 2020, no competitions in 2021 and 2022 because of the Covid pandemic, and because of that disruption, could not get a band ready to compete in 2023

This year our Band was also presented with the very prestigious Eilidh MacLeod Endeavour Award. This is presented to the Band which has demonstrated the following attributes: perseverance and resilience in the face of challenges; community contribution; enthusiasm and camaraderie; innovation; and/or efforts to include everyone.

All this costs a lot, and, as you will see from the attached pocket history of South West of Scotland Piping & Drumming Academy, all we do for the children, their parents and for their schools is completely free of charge.
