Update from Previous Meeting

Local Crime of note for Dumfries area:

- Community Officers currently targeting those involved in Anti-Social Behaviour in Dumfries. Support Unit staff have been in Dumfries at weekends and the Police helicopter carried out a patrols.
- Road Policing Officers continue to carry out static checks as part of our commitment to target individuals putting themselves and others at risk whilst driving under the influence of drink or drugs
- Our Town Centre Officers have identified a number of persons from travelling crime groups who have committed crime within our area and they will be reported for numerous offences.
- 2 youths arrested and charged following 2 quadbikes being stolen within the Dumfries area.
- 70 parking tickets issues in Dumfries in the period of 01/07/2024 to 18/08/2024.

Local Crimes of Note (26/07/2024 - 26/08/2024)

- Cannabis cultivation found within derelict building, with £520,000 worth of cannabis seized.
- Male arrested and charged with a serious assault and attempt murder at 2 separate licensed premises within Dumfries which occurred on the same date.
- 6 youths charged with serious assault on male and released on Police undertaking with conditions not to enter Dumfries Town Centre.
- 2 males from Glasgow who travelled to area to commit crime were traced and charged with theft by shoplifting.
- A number of youths were searched and found in possession of illegal drugs, incidents reported to youth justice.
- Male arrested and charged in relation to 2 indecent exposures in Dumfries town centre.
- Male arrested following disturbance outside residential properties, fought violently and a number of officers assaulted with one requiring hospital treatment. Male was subsequently remanded.
